AAUW Scholarships Awarded to Eight Women

Our Fort Atkinson branch of AAUW awarded nine scholarships in 2021. Since 1984 our membership has awarded 187 scholarships totaling \$348,550. This year \$18,000 was presented.

- The Second Chance scholarship is available to women who plan to continue their education at a vocational or technical college after having been out of the mainstream of education for more than one year. A total of \$9,500 was awarded for the Fort Atkinson Second Chance and \$7,000 for the Jefferson Second Chance.
- The Jane Shaw Knox Undergraduate Scholarship of \$2,000 was awarded to one young woman this year.
- The Jane Shaw Knox Graduate Scholarship is offered to women who are pursuing a graduate degree at an accredited college. A total of \$6,500 was awarded this year to four women.

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

- About 1 in 8 women in the United States will get invasive breast cancer in their lifetime.
- In 2021, nearly 300,000 cases of invasive breast cancer cases will be diagnosed in the US, along with nearly 50,000 new cases on non-invasive cases.
- About 43,600 women in the US are expected to die this year from breast cancer. Numbers for women under 50 have been remaining stable since 2007 but have been dropping for women over 50.
- For women, breast cancer retains the highest death rate next to lung cancer in the US.
- As of January 1st of this year, there are more than 2.8 MILLION women with a history of breast cancer in the US.
- Breast cancer remains the most commonly diagnosed cancer among women, with 30% of all newly diagnosed cancer cases.
