

Wrapping Up the Year

It is hard to believe that we are wrapping up this year and planning for the next. It has been an eventful year, anticipating the presidential election in the fall, and living out its aftermath in the spring. I don't know what the change in national priorities will mean for our organization going forward. I don't know what the changes in policy toward other countries will mean for some of our national programs like the AAUW sponsored international fellowships. I was able to be on the AAUW review panel for that award this year and was very impressed by sincerity, passion, and talent displayed by the applicants. Can the award recipients still come to the US to study? Will they still want to come?

At our branch scholarship committee we had some discussion about whether or not we will continue to be able to specifically award scholarships to girls/ women. State and federal program awards must be merit based (without using criteria of sex). Is limiting opportunity or giving advantage to one sex over the other discriminatory? Not just in a legal sense but in a moral sense? We all felt it was (is) wrong when girls/women were (are) overlooked or overtly excluded relative to boys/men. Have we advanced to a point where we don't need to make corrections for bias? Sadly, I don't think that we have. And I think all that we (we, as a group with shared values) can do is to keep making those corrections where and when we can, first in ourselves, then in our community, and maybe, someday the world.

AAUW Scholarships Totaling \$29,000 to be Presented for 2025-26

The Fort Atkinson branch of AAUW (American Association of University Women) will present scholarships to area women for the 2025-26 school year. The Fort Atkinson Community Foundation and the Jefferson Community Foundation administer these funds which are supported by AAUW's annual Used Book Sale, which is scheduled to take place in September at the Fort Atkinson Municipal Building. The Fort Foundation manages the Jane Shaw Knox Undergraduate and Graduate scholarships along with the Second Chance Scholarship while the Jefferson Community Foundation manages another Second Chance Scholarship.

AAUW Second Chance Scholarship

The AAUW Second Chance Scholarship is available to women who plan to continue their education at a vocational or technical college or for undergraduate work, after having been out of the mainstream of education for more than one year. Applicants must be either a graduate of Fort Atkinson High School, a resident of Fort Atkinson, or be currently employed in Fort Atkinson. The Jefferson Second Chance Scholarship is available to Jefferson High School graduates, residents of Jefferson, or currently employed in Jefferson.

AAUW Undergraduate Scholarship

The AAUW Jane Shaw Knox Undergraduate Scholarship is offered to women who are pursuing a bachelor's degree at an accredited college or university. Applicants must be either graduates of Fort Atkinson High School, residents of Fort Atkinson, or be employed in Fort Atkinson.

AAUW Jane Shaw Knox Graduate Scholarship

The Jane Shaw Knox AAUW Graduate Scholarship is offered to women who are pursuing a graduate degree at an accredited college. Applicants must be either graduates of Fort Atkinson High School, residents of Fort Atkinson, or be employed in Fort Atkinson.




Dues Increase
